### Indian Independence Day Celebrations

15 August 2022



As India celebrated its 76th year of Independence, LIS school community proudly gathered in the Oasis campus to mark the observance. It is pivotal to remember the importance of this day, the history of our nation, and the sacrifices our great freedom fighters made to gain this independence. Loyola International School believes that the achievement that we celebrated on this day is just a step, an opening of opportunity, to the greater triumphs that awaits us as a nation and its people both within the country and beyond.

Hoisting the National Flag, the Nation's pride, is a prime event on this occasion. The celebrations began on the school ground with the flag hoisting by the chief guest, Mr. Prasad Koduru (Chairperson of Advisory committee to ICC, Qatar) along with the School Principal , Mr Pramod Kumar Ranwaka and Mr Jayanth Lakkaraju (Manager of Administration of LIS, Al Nasr branch). #### Mob Dance - 100 Days - 100 Students

This competition helped students improve their spelling, increase their vocabulary, learn concepts, and develop the usage of correct English. Super Saturdays were organised in LIS for all the parents and teachers to meet and discuss strategies to enrich student's learning experience and bring out the best in them. Attendances of parents were high starting from primary level to high school.



### Subject Enrichment Activities - June

#### Subject and Predicate (1 June 2022)

Importance of identifying the subject and predicate in a sentence is unquestionable. To emphasize the learning through an activity, students were grouped into 2 and were asked to find subject and predicate, form a sentence using them, and write it in the notebook. This helped the children build a solid foundation of grammar and helped them understand the type of the subject. Through this activity, students were able to form a correct structure of a sentence using subject and predicate, and improve their writing skills.



#### Weights and Measurements

Role of measurements in our day to day lives can be well appreciated while shopping for grocery. Students of grade 3 learnt about weight measurements as they sat down to make a list of the items they purchased along with their weights in Kg and grams. This gave them a fair idea about the quantities and the measurements associated with it.



#### Spin the wheel- WH words game

Grade 3 students learnt the WH question words. In order to reinforce their learning, they played a game of spinning the WH words wheel. They spun a pin in the center of their wheels and had to form questions using the WH word which the pin stopped at. The students enjoyed playing this fun language game.



#### **Short Story Writing**

Story writing is a wonderful way to boost children's creativity and imagination. Grade 4 students were divided into 5 teams of four, and were given pictures of different stories. Students arranged the pictures in a sequence and formed stories. Through this, the students were able to organise their ideas and put them into words, enhance their vocabulary power and develop team coordination.



#### The Food | Eat

Grade 2 students were asked to bring different kinds of fruits, vegetables, nuts & cereals. The food items were then segregated into three categories - Energy giving food, body building food and Protective food. Through this activity, students learnt about the importance of food, and the purpose of each category of food in our growth.



#### **States of Matter**

Matter is all around us. In the air we breathe and all we touch and see. Understanding the concept of molecular arrangement in different states of matter was the objective of the activity. Students of grade 4 used various pulses to show how molecules are arranged in solid, liquid and gaseous states.



#### **Time to Learn Time**

Time is precious and we should not waste any. Activities help students grasp concepts effectively. This time, it was all about time! Students of grade 2 enjoyed drawing a clock and colouring it. Through this activity, they learnt to draw a clock correctly and differentiate between the Minute Hand and the Hour Hand.



#### Soil Composition Activity by Grade 3 Students

It is no secret that children and soil pretty much go hand in hand. Children usually love to find a dirt patch and dig or romp in it. They were gripped while they learn that the soil is the basis for life and growth! Teaching children "Caring for the Planet starts from the Ground" was one of the major goals of the Soil Activity. Students of LIS demonstrated an activity which emphasized the differences in soil types and what these differences mean to people and to plants.



#### **General Knowledge Activity**

Learning about things that we come across everyday, and associate our observations to the learnings can get very interesting. Grade 3 students learnt how sound waves travel through different mediums by creating a string telephone and communicating through it. They also learnt about how this simple idea of sound travelling through strings led to the invention of telephones.


